

Dana Vallangeon, MD, DABFM, FASAM, DipABLM Dr. Dana Vallangeon, MD, graduated from Olivet Nazarene University, where she received the Maggie Sloan Honor Award for Most Outstanding Woman Graduate. She went on to graduate summa cum laude from The Ohio State University College of Medicine and completed her family practice residency at Mount Carmel, serving as Chief Resident. She is Board Certified in Family Medicine. Dr. Vallangeon founded and served as CEO and Staff Physician of Lower Lights Christian Health Center for 17 years. Lower Lights, a faith based Federally Qualified Health Center, now provides a medical home for more than 14,000 patients and delivers more than 65,000 visits annually. She earned Board Certification in Addiction Medicine in 2018 and later served as Medical Director at Maryhaven before becoming Chief Medical Officer at the Ohio Association of Community Health Centers. She also provided adult primary care (0.25 FTE) at Southeast Healthcare, an FQHC in Columbus serving urban, medically underserved, largely homeless, and clinically complex populations. Her clinical focus includes treatment of substance use and opioid use disorders, along with integrated Hepatitis C and HIV screening, prevention, treatment, and linkage to ongoing primary and psychiatric care.
